



Ned's Notes: The Song of Mary (often known as the *Magnificat*, the first word of the Latin version), has been treated musically hundreds of times, if not thousands. Our **Organ Voluntaries** are movements of small "suites" for organ by the great French organist, Marcel Dupré, known chiefly as organist of the *Eglise Saint Sulpice*, in the 6th district (*arrondissement*) of Paris: *Suscepit Israel puerum suum* ("He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel") would have been played in place of certain verses (in "*alternatum*") of the Latin *Magnificat* sung by a choir. The Marian hymn *Ave Maris Stella*

("Hail, Star of the Sea") would have been sung/played in the same manner – his *Amen* being the last brilliant movement of the set. As for our **Offertory Anthem**, living English composer Philip Moore set *Magnificat* in English in similar way, in that the choir sings verses of the text in plainsong in *alternatum* with verses sung in rich, 4-part harmony accompanied by the organ. Our **Communion Anthem** is a setting of a 12th century text (a "troped," elaborated version of the traditional *Ave Maria*) and melody from a manuscript found in Beauvais (about 2 hours north of Paris).


